WHAT IS CUB SCOUT DAY CAMP?

Day Camp is a fun-filled week for Cub Scouts to work on rank advancement, explore the outdoors, have fun with other Scouts and continue the Scouting experience during the summer.

This is a Foothills District led event. As such, we'll be able to provide Archery and BB's. Tigers, Wolves and Bears can get a jump on badge requirements in the 2013-14 year. Webelos will complete four Activity Pins - Sportsman, Scientist, Handyman & Engineer.

In addition to that, all of the Scouts will work on crafts, participate in sports, watch presentations from local organizations during lunch time and get to make new friends.

You can drop your children off at camp in the morning or work out a carpool arrangement with others from your Pack. Each child will receive two T-shirts, which they must wear (it's our camp uniform). Scouts must bring lunch and snacks.

Please note: this is NOT a day care facility. We only operate from 8:30 to 2:30 pm each day, with no before or after hours operations. Children *MUST* be picked up promptly.

WE NEED VOLUNTEERS LIKE YOU!

Day Camp is run by volunteers, i.e. the parents. Each pack <u>must</u> provide one 5-day adult volunteer for every four (4) scouts from their pack. (Note: Tiger scouts <u>must</u> be accompanied by an Adult Partner at all times and are not included in the 1:4 ratio).

Five-day volunteers will receive a free T-shirt, a reduced cost on your Scout(s) registration, and non-Scout siblings will also be allowed to attend: This includes tot-lot aged children (3 years and fully potty trained to K), and girls in 1st to 5th grades. We also love to have teen-helpers (14 -18 years old).

SPACE SHIP RULES

SHOES: Because of the activities, shoes must cover toes and heel. Open-toed shoes, sandals, Crocs, toe-shoes, etc. are NOT allowed.

<u>T-SHIRT</u>: Scouts must wear the official Camp T-shirt (you're provided 2), every day. This is for camp safety. Additional shirts are \$10.00 each.

<u>PARENTS</u>: You are welcome in the camp, but for security reasons, <u>you MUST check in at security every day you visit</u>. You will be issued a name tag which must be worn at all times.

<u>PICKUP</u>: Children will only be allowed to leave with parents or guardians as noted on the registration form. Unless we are informed in writing in advance and the person has the designated carpool number, no one else may pick up your child.

<u>LEAVING EARLY</u>: If you need your camper to leave early, you may sign him out of at security.

<u>KNIVES</u>: Children may not bring knives to camp, even if they have earned the Whittling Chip.

<u>PROHIBITED ITEMS</u>: Alcohol, caffeine and all tobacco products are **not allowed**. This applies to camp staff, parents, friends, relatives and all visitors.

CAMP SAFETY

The safety of your child while at Day Camp is paramount. Here are a few of the safety precautions:

- The camp directors have completed the BSA National Camp School.
- The Archery and BB Gun instructors are BSA certified.
- There will be a medical professional on site at all times.
- All staff members will also wear an official camp uniform.
- Cobb County public safety officials are aware of the camp and can respond immediately if there is an emergency.

PACK REGISTRATION

Registration is by Pack only. See your Pack's Day Camp Coordinator. Packs must provide one 5-day adult volunteer for every 4 Scouts in order to run camp so please consider volunteering. Early registration deadline is April 26. Late registration is April 27- May 4. After May 4 registrations will not be accepted -- no exceptions.

All registrants will receive a confirmation email by mid-May. If you have not received one, contact your Pack Day Camp Coordinator as soon as possible. Your form may have been lost. Email is our primary form of communication.

If your pack does not have a Day Camp Coordinator, consider volunteering yourself. You do not have to attend camp, merely find adult leaders to meet the requirement and send in the applications.

We suggest your pack work out a car pool system so everyone doesn't have to drive every day.
